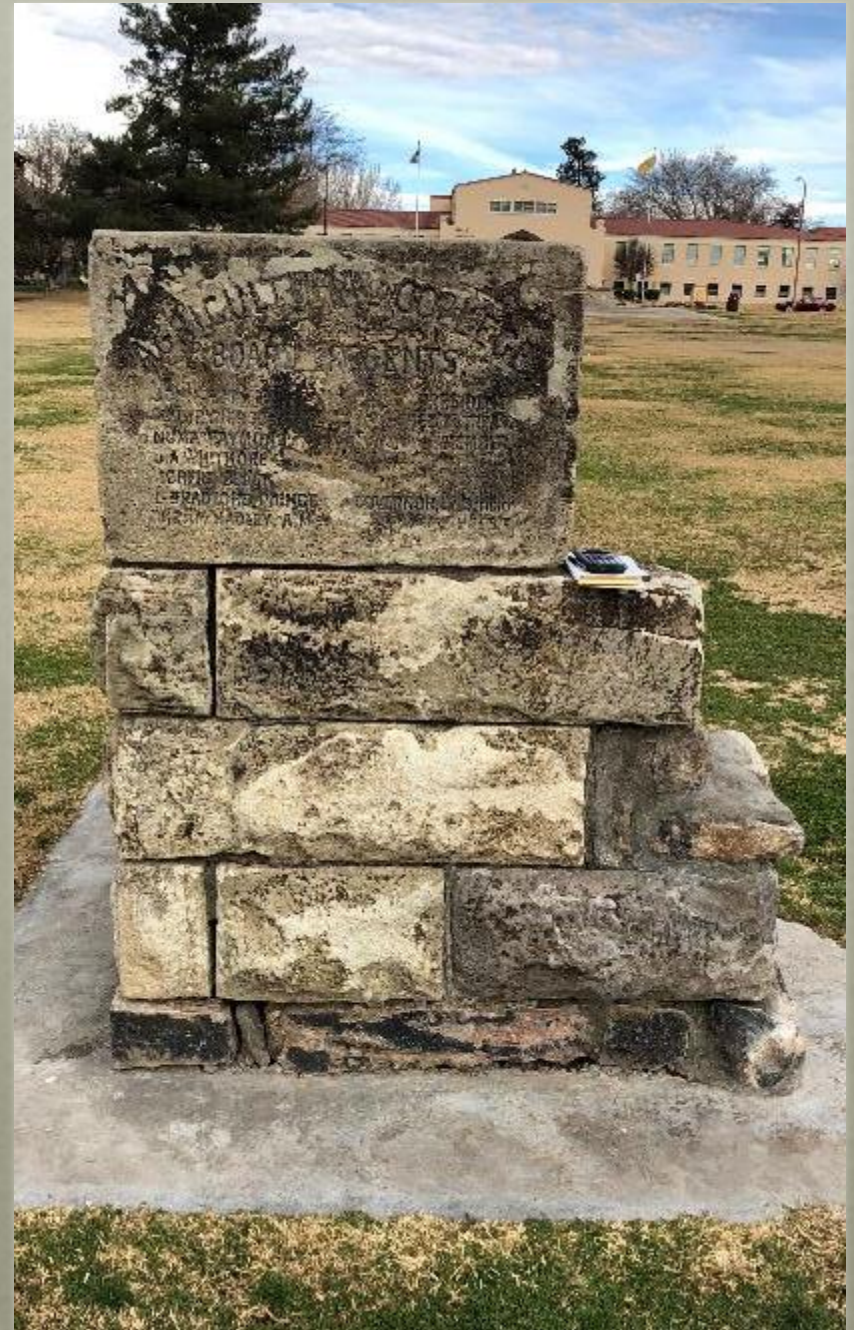


WHY JOIN A CLUB?

Every year we build the playing field for BEST Robotics. It is a very rewarding experience to see something that you helped build, being used as a way to promote engineering and science among young students



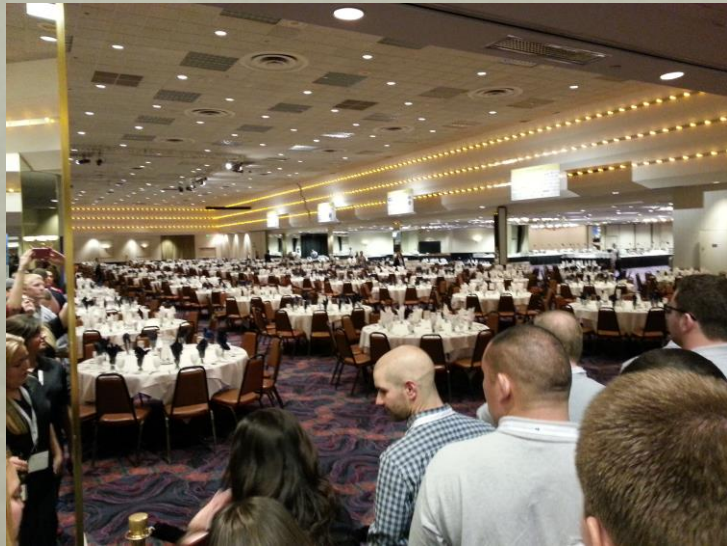
